**O** God, the pastor and ruler of all the faithful, mercifully look upon thy servant Damien, whom thou hast chosen to be the pastor and ruler of the Church in this Diocese: grant unto him, we beseech thee, to be in word and conversation a wholesome example to the people committed to his charge; that he with them may attain at last to the crown of everlasting life. Through...

#### **Secret**

**W**e beseech thee, O Lord, mercifully to accept these our oblations: grant unto Damien, thy servant, that like as thou hast chosen him to be pastor and ruler of the Church in this Diocese; so he may be governed evermore by thy defence. Through...

#### **Post-Communion**
